

Highlights: Ohio State Comes From Behind To Beat Wisconsin, 34-21

It may not have been Ohio State's prettiest win, with the Buckeyes trailing at the half for the first time all season, but Ohio State secure a playoff berth with a 34-21 win over Wisconsin on Saturday night in the Big Ten championship. The Buckeyes got off to a slow start, trailing 21-7 at the half, but a second half explosion from both sides of the ball propelled Ryan Day's squad to a come from behind victory against the Badgers.

The Buckeyes were held largely in check in the first 30 minutes, unable to find much success, and, in turn unable to make highlight plays. A wild catch from Austin Mack one was of just a few bright spots.

J.K. Dobbins put Ohio State on the board late in the first half, but Wisconsin was able to respond with a touchdown of its own shortly after.

The Buckeyes received the ball to open the second half and drove straight down the field, capped by a one-handed touchdown snag for tight end Jeremy Ruckert.

On the following drive, Ohio State sacked Jack Coan and benefitted from a fumbled snap to put its offense into great field position. The offense would cash in with a field goal to cut the deficit to four.

Nearing the end of the third quarter, Ohio State took its first lead of the game on a brilliant touchdown from K.J. Hill.
